What's Happening

Customers Given More Time for Water and Sewer Payments

Did you notice that you have more time to pay your City utility bill and there is now a 10-day grace period before penalties are applied? Starting in May, bills are now due 20 days from when the City mails them and a 10-day grace period after the due date has been added before penalties are applied. This gives customers 15 more days to make a payment before penalties are charged. This means that if your bill is due on the 1st of the month, you will only receive a penalty if the bill is not paid by the 11th of the month. Please remember that if you make a payment after the due date, it is possible that your next bill could show a prior balance.

Rethink Conservation



The Water Conservation Incentive Program, "Rethink Conservation" was presented at the Joliet Water Conservation Stakeholder Meeting in April. Rental Inspection Program

On October 4, 2022, the Joliet City Council approved several changes to the City's rental inspection program. This change added all residential units occupied by anyone other than the owner including single family homes, condos, and two-unit properties in which the owner resides in one unit. In addition, there is now a requirement for owners to register and obtain a license with a cost of \$100 annually. The intent of the rental inspection program is to:

- · Promote the health, safety, and welfare of the general public
- · Assure preservation of the existing housing supply
- · Help maintain property values
- Work toward eliminating substandard and deteriorating rental housing
- Maintain a living environment that contributes to healthful individual and family living

Please be certain that you have completed and submitted your registration form. Each unique owner (i.e. each entity) requires a license. The registration form is required to list all rental properties held by the owner. Construction Zone: 2023 Water Main Replacement Projects and 2024 Look Ahead

For the last 5 years (2017 to 2021) Public Utilities has replaced 1% of the City's water main on an annual basis. Beginning in 2022, the City accelerated the water main replacement program and replaced 3% of our water mains. Continuing in 2023, this accelerated water main replacement

program is part of the City's non-revenue water reduction strategy as required by IDNR to maintain our Lake Michigan Allocation. Between 2023 and 2030 we will be replacing all water mains constructed prior to the 1970s.

In 2023, eleven construction contracts have been awarded to replace approximately 130,000 linear feet of water main. To keep up to date with current projects under construction and to view projects anticipated for construction in 2024 visit at www.Joliet.gov/construction-zone.





Roadway Reconstruction

Since 1982, the Department of Public Works has reconstructed neighborhood streets within the City of Joliet. The 2023 Roadway Reconstruction Program includes both streets from previous years reconstruction programs that were delayed due to utility conflicts as well as additional streets for 2023. Roadway Reconstruction Projects are scheduled to take place beginning in late Spring through late Fall.

The following is a listing of streets to be reconstructed (storm sewer, curb and gutter, road reconstruction) as part of the 2023 Roadway Reconstruction Program:

- Broadway Street (Marion Street Jefferson Street)
- Cora Street (Frank Avenue Russell Street)
- Dekalb Street (Pleasant Avenue Center Street)
- Dora Avenue (Woodruff Road Garvin Street)
- Garnsey Avenue Bridge over Spring Creek: Bridge Replacement
- Helen Avenue (Charity Avenue Mills Road)
- Parks Avenue (Elwood Avenue Liberty Street)
- Stone Street (Hickory Street Center Street)
- Wallace Street (Pleasant Avenue Center Street)
- Walsh Avenue (Douglas Street Taylor Street)
- Washington Street (York Street Eastern Avenue)

In addition to reconstructing numerous streets, the Department of Public Works completes an Annual Roadway Resurfacing Program on various streets throughout the City. The 2023 Roadway Resurfacing Program is funded with approximately \$4.4 million of Motor Fuel Tax and \$7.25 million in Capital Improvement funding. A full list of streets to be resurfaced in 2023 will be provided in a future Newsletter.

Property owners are advised to seek alternate routes when a given street is being reconstructed. Please contact the Department of Public Works at (815) 724-4200 with questions or concerns regarding the 2023 Roadway Reconstruction Program.

Water Quality Report

Customer Water Portal

Are you signed up for the Customer Water Portal? This free tool helps you monitor your water monthly, weekly, daily, or hourly! Key features allow you to view water usage in gallons or cubic feet, set vacation and usage alerts, and help track down the source of usage at odd times. How to Report a Streetlight Outage

Please call Public Works at (815) 724-4200 to report street light outages. The following detailed information is needed:

- What is the pole made out of? Concrete, wood, aluminum, or decorative.
- Exact address or intersection where pole is located, including side of street, nearest side street, and name of subdivision.
- Pole number when available: If concrete pole number is located on the street side of pole, eye-level, yellow plaque with black numbers. If aluminum pole, it is halfway up the pole, white plaque with black letters and numbers?
- Is the light out? Does it go on / off? Is the lens dim? Does the pole lean or is it deteriorated? Has the pole been knocked down? Are wires exposed?

Depending on what the pole is made of determines who fixes it. The more detailed the information, the quicker response time for getting it fixed.

Reminders for Property Standards

- Lawns must be kept under 8 inches in height, this includes weeds.
- The parkway is the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain. This includes the alley, or in some subdivisions the rear parkway.
- The outdoor storage of one recreational vehicle or one watercraft not exceeding 25 feet in length or 10 feet in height is allowed but must be parked on paved surface areas that are not located in a required front yard space.
- Trash cans and lawn waste bags should not be placed at the curb until 6:30 pm the day before trash pickup, and all containers must be removed from the curb within 10 hours of collection.
- No person shall place any municipal waste at any collection point unless the municipal waste is from the premises served by the container or from the premises at which the collection point is located.
