Dedication of World War II Submarine Memorial

On Wednesday, June 14, the United States Submarine Veterans Chicago Base, in collaboration with the City of Joliet, unveiled a new monument to honor the 28 World War II submarines that passed through Joliet.

The United States contracted the Manitowoc Ship Building Company to build 28 Gato/Balao Class submarines for the U.S. Navy during WWII. After completion of crew training and sea trials in Lake Michigan, these submarines sailed through the Chicago River and the Sanitary & Ship Canal to Lockport where they were placed on specialty-built floating dry docks. These dry docks then moved through the locks, through Joliet, onwards to the Mississippi River and then down to New Orleans, Louisiana. Once their periscopes were reinstalled, they traveled across the Gulf of Mexico through the Panama Canal to the Pacific theater of WWII.

Four of the Manitowoc Submarines, the USS Golet SS-361, USS Kete SS-369, USS Lagarto SS-371, and USS Robalo SS273, were lost in combat during the war, with the loss of over 300 officers and men. These four submarines brought the total number of submarines lost in World War II, to 52. A total of 3,000 officers and men are now on Eternal Patrol.

On the front side of this Monument are replicas of Navy Submarine Dolphins and the USS Chicago Base Logo followed by a description of the Manitowoc Submarines Story. The opposite side lists the names of the 28 submarines that were built by the Manitowoc Ship Building Company. Of these 28, the four previously identified were lost in combat.



The monument is located next to the existing Veterans Memorial, on the south side of Bicentennial at 30 N Bluff Street. The City invites you to visit and pay your respects.





Street Sweeping in the Fall

Residents are reminded that raking leaves onto the street is not allowed by City ordinance unless specific permission is granted by the City to a particular area to do so. The City will not collect leaves that have been placed in the street or the parkway. Any repeat violation of this prohibition could subject the homeowner to a fine of \$150.00 or more.

When leaves have been raked into the street in large piles, the street sweepers are unable to pick up those leaves as the leaves and hidden debris (branches, bottles, metal, etc.) could cause damage to the mechanical parts in the sweeper. Therefore, the street sweeper will go around these leaf piles and thus the roadway will not be cleared of leaves. The presence of leaves in the street and on the parkway will most likely close off drainage and cause drainage problems, as well as increasing the chance of vehicular and pedestrian accidents on slippery leaf-covered streets.

Water Pipe Winter Preparedness

- Disconnect outdoor hoses from spigots and turn off the outdoor spigot.
- 2. Make sure the main shut-off valve is in good working order. If not, contact Public Utilities at (815) 724-4220 to schedule your turn-off when you are ready to make your repairs.
- 3. Insulate pipes that are susceptible to freezing.

Fall Cleanup - Yard Waste Collection

Waste Management has provided a few tips and pointers below for yard waste disposal. Remember, the last week for yard waste collection is December 4-8, 2023.



- Yard waste consists of grass clippings, leaves, shrubbery, tree branches (less than three inches in diameter), and brush.
- Brush and branches must be cut into 4-foot lengths and securely bundled with string or twine. Each bundle must not exceed 50 lbs. Unbundled brush and branches will not be collected.
- Sod, dirt, rock, whole trees, stumps, limbs greater than 3 inches in diameter, and animal feces are not part of the weekly yard waste program.
- YARD WASTE ONLY labels are available at no charge at Joliet City Hall and Joliet Jewel Osco store locations.
- Yard waste must be placed in either brown paper yard waste bags or in clearly labeled 32-gallon containers. All 32-gallon containers used for yard waste must be properly labeled if used for yard waste collection.
- Residents can also rent or purchase 96-gallon yard waste carts by calling Waste Management at the phone number below.

Help the City of Joliet help you in keeping your street clean and keeping the storm drains operational by "adopting" a catch basin which is usually a grate covered street drain in or near a curb. Adopt a catch basin by keeping an eye on any catch basins that may be located in front or near your house by keeping it clear of debris throughout the year.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can I burn excess yard waste, leaves, tree limbs, garbage, or any other unwanted materials on my property?

A: No. Open burning of any waste material within the Joliet city limits is prohibited.

- To report an open burning issue, contact our Non-Emergency Police and Fire Department Line at (815) 726-2491 as it is occurring, or 9-1-1 in emergency.
- Ordinance No. 18216 Search Open Burning.

Q: Can I have a fire pit?

A: Yes, however, the fire pit must be a commercial built pit with steel legs, wire mesh sides, and have a top.

- Fire pits must be 15 feet from any combustible building or fence, and a garden hose nearby is recommended.
- Only hardwood logs or commercially made logs (Dura-Logs) are to be burned.
- Smoke from a fire pit that is found offensive may be ordered to be extinguished.
- To report a contained fire pit issue, contact the Non-Emergency Police and Fire Department Line at (815) 726-2491 as it is occurring, or 9-1-1 in emergency.
- Ordinance No. 18216 Search Fire Pit.

Q: Who can I contact to report a water or sewer issue, fire hydrant, or watermain break?

A: Residents should contact the 24-Hour Emergency Public Utilities line at (815) 724-4220 to report any problems with the City's water and or sewer systems.

- If an operator is not available at the time of your call, leave a detailed message of the issue, the address location the issue is occurring at, along with a contact name and number.
- Residents are not given prior notice of temporary repair work due to the urgency of the repair and number of homes affected by the break.

Q: Who can I contact to report a street light outage?

A: Street light outages can be reported to Public Works at (815) 724-4200 or through our free VUEWorks: CitizenVUE citizen engagement mobile app or online portal available on www.joliet.gov, click on the report button on our homepage to start your request. When calling to report the issue, the caller should be prepared to give the following information:

- · Closest address location, along with resident's contact information.
- Type of pole wood, concrete, steel, decorative green or black.
- Pole number, if applicable, to determine if the pole is maintained by the City of Joliet or ComEd.
- Repair times can vary depending on the issue that is causing the outage.
- To report a ComEd street light issue or outage call (800) 334-7661 or visit www.comed.com online to report.
