# A Message from Mayor D'Arcy

Dear Neighbor,

Joliet has passed some major milestones in recent months, including welcoming our first female City Manager, Beth Beatty. Beth brings nearly 20 years of municipal

government experience working closely with members of the Chicago City Council and a law degree to her new position. She will be responsible for the daily operations of our nearly 900 employees and \$500 million dollar budget.

The 2024 city budget was adopted in late November with the City Council approving funding for road and sidewalk repairs and for the proposed City Square and Chicago Street Projects.

With spring upon us, the city will continue our annual program to upgrade and replace water mains throughout the city under the 2024 Water Main Replacement Program. Water main replacement is an essential part of the city's infrastructure maintenance to keep our water system in good condition, improve reliability, and reduce water loss from leaks in old water main pipes. The city will be replacing over 20 miles of water mains in 2024 and continue the process through 2030 as required prior to switching to Lake Michigan water.

Our collective thanks to the city's Public Works Department for their efforts in salting roads and snow removal during the winter months. They will now begin the process of beautifying our community for the spring and summer months.

On behalf of the City Council and staff we thank you for your continued support.

- 24/7 access to monitor water usage hourly, daily, weekly, or monthly
- · Set alerts if usage is nearing previous month usage
- · Set vacation alerts
- Find possible leaks quickly by monitoring usage during overnight hours or while gone

#### Dye test your toilets

- · Add a few drops of food coloring to your toilet tank
- · Wait 15 minutes
- If any color shows up in the bowl, you need to check the seals and flapper

## GARAGE SALE PERMIT INFORMATION

Spring Cleaning means Garage Sales for many people. City of Joliet residents must get a garage sale permit if they intend to conduct a garage sale. Each individual can have two sales per year. Neighborhood/Subdivision/Groups can also have two sales per year for 5 or more addresses. Dates of sale must be consecutive and cannot exceed 4 days. Cost for 1 individual is \$6 per sale and for a Neighborhood/Subdivision/Group the cost is \$30 per sale.

Garage Sale Permits can only be obtained in person at the City of Joliet City Hall located at 150 W. Jefferson St. in downtown Joliet during regular business hours Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Parking is free for up to 30 minutes outside of City Hall in designated spots. Residents cannot apply or pay online for a garage sale permit, and permits will not be mailed.

For Neighborhood/Subdivision/Groups (5 or more addresses), applicant(s) will need to provide the following: name of subdivision, name of person in charge of the garage sale, names (first and last) of all participants, complete addresses of all participants. Names cannot be added after permit has been issued. There are no rain dates, no substitutions, and no refunds.

## **Waste Management Reminder**

The City of Joliet and Waste Management would like to remind the residents of Joliet that the resumption of yard waste collection will begin the week of March 11, 2024. Yard waste collection had been suspended for the winter.

Yard Waste Only labels are available at City Hall and Jewel-Osco for yard waste cans. If cans are used they must have the Yard Waste Only label.

Acceptable items include grass clippings, leaves, tree branches (broken into a manageable length) and brush which must be bundled and tied into 4-foot lengths. Non-acceptable items include dirt, stone, concrete and rock, whole trees, and sod.
