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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: 2013 CAPER

The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) provides a summary of the actions taken during fiscal year 2013 to meet the housing and community development needs identified in the **2013 Annual Action Plan** and funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME funds.

As of January 1, 2013, the City had no CDBG funds and \$522,054.67 in HOME funds. Activities undertaken in 2013 were funded with remaining entitlement funds and program income totaling \$21,004.18 that was received during the year.

In the 2010 Consolidated Plan, the City of Joliet identified the following priority needs and specific objectives to increase housing opportunities for all residents of Joliet and promote stability in declining areas:

1. Affordable Housing

- a. To increase the supply of decent, safe and affordable housing.
- b. To increase the ability of low and moderate-income households to become homeowners.
- c. To promote safe, decent and affordable housing through code enforcement.

2. Preserving Existing Affordable Housing

- a. Elimination of blighting influences in the neighborhoods through clearance and demolition.
- b. Revitalization of distressed affordable housing that expands housing opportunity.

3. Public Service

- a. Graffiti removal from public and private property.
- b. Funding of the Neighborhood Newsletter.
- c. Homeless Services (Substantial Amendment).

4. Public Infrastructure

a. Infrastructure improvements in low- and moderate-income areas.

For Program Year 2013, which was the fourth year of the five year Consolidated Plan period (2010 – 2014), the City of Joliet determined that any CDBG program income received would have the most impact in Code Enforcement – Demolition. No other CDBG activities were undertaken in 2013. The City of Joliet funded Code Enforcement – Inspections and Graffiti

Removal with general corporate monies in 2013. HOME funds totaling \$128,586.49 were disbursed for the final payment of the five year commitment to the Housing Authority of Joliet's Liberty Meadows Estates Development. No other HOME activities were undertaken in 2013. It is anticipated that Cornerstone Services, Inc. and Will County Habitat for Humanity will complete their housing projects in 2014, which are partially funded with previously committed 2009 and 2010 HOME funds.

The City continued to fund NSP1 activities from its allocation of \$3,531,810.00. At the end of 2013, a total of \$4,534,715.17 in grant funds and program income had been disbursed. A total of twenty-eight properties have been acquired since the program's inception. Of eighteen rehabilitated/constructed single family homes, eleven have been sold to qualified first-time homebuyers and five conveyed to non-profit organizations and the local housing authority to provide rental housing. The rehabilitation of the two remaining properties will be completed in 2014, at which time they will be sold to qualified homebuyers. Nine properties are currently land banked and a total of twenty-one properties (including the nine land banked properties) have been demolished. Three additional demolitions are planned for 2014.

The City was awarded \$1,890,000.00 in NSP3 funds from the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) in 2011. The City has rehabbed two properties, one of which was sold to a first-time homebuyer and one which will be conveyed to the Housing Authority of Joliet. The three new construction homes will be completed in early 2014 and sold to qualified applicants. Two additional rehabilitation properties will be completed and one property will be demolished in early 2014. The City will expend all grant funds by the March 15, 2014 deadline.

The Local Homestead inventory at year end consisted of one condominium unit, which will be conveyed to Will County Habitat for Humanity in the first quarter of 2014. No additional properties were purchased in 2013 for this program.

Code enforcement - inspections, which was funded with city monies in 2013, were lower than expected due to a reduced staff. A total of 4494 cases were assigned to the property maintenance evaluators and 3626 cases closed. The number of demolitions was also below the anticipated goal. One non city-owned property, located in the City's target area, was demolished with 2013 CDBG program income. The City was, however, able to demolish three privately owned properties in the target area with NSP1 funds.

Graffiti removal was funded with city monies in 2013. Graffiti was removed from a total of 683 facades. The graffiti removal program's success is due in large measure to the City's constant efforts to increase public awareness of the program coupled with the service being offered free of charge. The graffiti abatement specialist works closely with the police department, neighborhood organizations and schools to abate nuisance graffiti in a timely and professional manner.

In the fall of 2013, the City executed FY 2011 - 2013 Grant Agreements with HUD for a total of \$2,734,685.00 in CDBG funds and \$1,196,984.00 in HOME funds.

NARRATIVE STATEMENTS

Assessment of the Three to Five Year Goals

The City of Joliet was able to partially fund one activity, Code Enforcement – Demolition with 2013 CDBG program income. No other activities were funded with grant funds. City monies were utilized to fund Code Enforcement – Inspections and Public Service – Graffiti Removal.

Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing

The City of Joliet is an active participant in the Will County Continuum of Care which includes representatives from local housing, health service, social service and child service agencies. The City is represented on the following committees:

• Leadership Committee: Neighborhood Services Director

• Housing/Plan to End Homelessness Committee: Neighborhood Services Director

• Ranking Committee: Neighborhood Services Director

Additionally, the Neighborhood Services Director serves on the board of the Will-Grundy Medical Clinic, which serves the uninsured residents of Will and Grundy counties. He is also on the steering committee of Advocates United for Joliet Children, which is an initiative bringing together early childhood stakeholders to build, advance and sustain a system of services and supports that ensures that all children in Joliet are ready for school success and able to achieve their full potential.

City engineers serve on the Hickory Creek Watershed Planning Group with other representatives of local government. The goals of this committee include: improve water quality, protect environmentally sensitive areas and habitat, enhance recreational uses, mitigate problem areas, public outreach, education and participation.

The City continued to operate its rental inspection program with general corporate funds in 2013 to maintain safe and secure rental housing for its residents. A total of 2,116 rental inspections were made. Properties that did not have a current certificate were not approved for occupancy. Complaints generated by residents were inspected for code violations. Those complaints, if found to be accurate, were required to be abated by the landlord. Rental properties with three units or more and all non-owner occupied two unit buildings were inspected. Properties were certified for two to four years, depending on the number of code violations and the timeliness of the property owner in correcting those violations. In its effort to continually provide ongoing education to area landlords, the City hosted its annual Landlord Conference in 2013. Over 200 landlords participated in the 2013 conference, which consisted of a three hour program which included presentations by the Joliet Police Department, Illinois Department of Human Rights, Joliet Regional Landlords Association, Will County Center for Community Concerns, Community Investment Corporation, Energy Savers and an Eviction Attorney. Landlords received the training program manual, the international property maintenance codes, rental inspection ordinances and other materials

deemed appropriate to promote decent and safe housing. Attendance was mandatory for landlords brought in for an administrative hearing and highly recommended for both new and existing landlords.

The Neighborhood Oriented Policing Team (NOPT) program continued to provide for better police/community relationships and fostered safer neighborhoods in 2013. Fourteen NOPT officers worked in eleven target areas throughout the City. These officers are familiar with the residents in their neighborhoods and respond to all calls for service during their shift. They are taught to seek long-term solutions to repeat problems and to work with residents to create a safer environment.

Affordable Housing

The City continued to provide affordable housing for low-income rental households with its remaining HOME funds. In 2012, Cornerstone Services, Inc. received commitments from the City totaling \$175,468.18 in HOME funds to construct two 6 bedroom group homes. Construction of these homes is expected to be completed in 2014. In 2013, the City disbursed the final installment of a \$1,050,000.00 five year commitment of HOME funds to the Housing Authority of Joliet for the Liberty Meadows Estates Development which consisted of the construction of 42 housing units.

Joliet, in cooperation with Will County and Bolingbrook, expended \$2.5 million in Neighborhood Stabilization Program funds from the State of Illinois. All properties have been purchased and more than fifty percent of the funding is being used by agencies such as Cornerstone Services, Housing Authority of Joliet, Trinity Services and Lambs Fold to provide permanent supportive housing throughout the County and City. Two of the homes for sale were constructed in the Forest Park area, which is part of the City of Joliet's target area.

The Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) awarded the City of Joliet \$1,890,000.00 in Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP3) funds. The primary focus of the NSP3 funding is to demonstrate impact by addressing the negative results of vacant and foreclosed properties on communities. In order to achieve the impact desired, all housing rehabbed and sold/rented must be within a designated target area. The target area is roughly outlined as Taylor Street on the North, Interstate 80 on the South, Collins Street on the East and Midland Avenue on the West. These funds have substantially similar requirements as NSP1 funding. The City has purchased five foreclosed properties for rehabilitation and undertaken the construction of three single family residences with these funds. The City will expend all grant funds by the March 15, 2014 deadline.

Community awareness and marketing are necessary components of a successful affordable housing program. In 2013, the City continued its outreach to the Joliet community to raise awareness of the NSP1 and NSP3 programs. The NSP properties were listed on the Multiple Listing Service (MLS) and advertised in local media by the realtor contracted by the City to sell the properties. The City continued its practice of sending information regarding the properties for sale to community stakeholders, requesting that it be made available to their employees and clients.

ASSIST Program: In 2013, the City ceded \$10,000,000 of its bonding volume capacity (CAP) to the Assist Program, which provides 3% cash assistance to homebuyers at a low interest rate from local lenders and also allows the homebuyer to obtain a Mortgage Credit Certificate of up to \$2,000.00 per year on their federal income taxes for the life of their loan.

Will County Continuum of Care

The Homeless Services Program was designed and initiated by the Will County Continuum of Care to provide services that would not be otherwise available to the homeless population and to "fill in the gaps" in homeless services. For the time period from October 1, 2011 through September 20, 2012, a total of 355 households, consisting of 455 individuals were served. The individuals served included 310 single adults and 45 families consisting of 48 adults and 97 children. The following breakdown is representative of where the 355 households stayed the night prior to their first service:

- 201 households were residing in an emergency shelter.
- 27 were enrolled in transitional housing programs.
- 24 were inconsistently staying with family/friends.
- 22 were on the streets without any form of shelter.
- 67 were in a substance abuse treatment program.
- 14 were temporarily staying in a hotel/motel.

A total of \$30,260.51 was expended for services during the program year. The average cost of services (not including case management) was \$85.24 per household or \$66.51 per person.

The 4th Week Phenomenon Program was a concept that formed during the Continuum's 10 year plan to end chronic homelessness. This program is designed for those representatives of the population that meet the description of the "4th Week Phenomenon" – individuals who live in the inexpensive hotels/motels in the area until their monthly benefits run out. They then move into shelters or live on the street for the fourth week of the month or until their monthly benefit become available again on the first of the month. Once the money is available, they move back into the hotels/motels until the money runs out again. During the program year that ran from 10/1/11 through 9/30/12, 73 persons participated in this program, which included 25 single adults and 11 families consisting of 15 adults and 33 children. Around 30% of the participants in this program to date have obtained a "positive outcome," which means they were placed into permanent or transitional housing.

Further explanation of the above referenced programs and other services provided locally by Will County Center for Community Concerns can be found in the Continuum's 2013 Annual Open Leadership Meeting Report which is included as **Exhibit A.** The City is represented on various committees of the Will County Continuum of Care by the Director of Neighborhood Services. Additionally, a Substantial Amendment to the City's 2010 – 2014 Consolidated Plan was made to include a new activity for 2011 and subsequent years: *Public Service – Homeless Services*. The City of Joliet intends to contract with Catholic Charities Daybreak Shelter in the amount of \$75,000.00 annually to provide health and housing counseling to homeless individuals from future CDBG allocations.

Other Actions

A. Obstacles to Meeting Underserved Needs

Affordable housing has been identified in the 2010 Consolidated Plan as the highest priority need. A major obstacle to addressing the need for affordable housing is the ongoing economic conditions. The impact of current economic conditions on city spending is evidenced by the 2013 budget which forecasted revenues to remain flat and further reduction in discretionary spending. Limited availability of state resources coupled with the no federal funding further exacerbated the city's ability to address underserved needs.

While the cost of acquiring properties for rehabilitation continues to be positively impacted by the current housing market, rising rehabilitation costs offset this benefit. Because the City's low and moderate census tract areas include the oldest sections of Joliet, historic preservation requirements continue to be an additional obstacle to affordable housing. Rehabilitation costs are driven up when elements must be fixed rather than replaced, due to their historic or architectural significance. The end result is an expensive home requiring additional down payment assistance and/or leveraged financing to work.


The City continues to work on Hickory Creek and Spring Creek, which flow through the heart of the east side low and moderate income census tracts. The project to deepen Hickory and Spring Creeks is funded by the Department of Natural Resources Division of Waterways and will not be completed for several years. Rehabilitation in flood plains is very difficult to complete and, in some instances, impossible to consider due to FEMA rules with regard to rehabilitation projects in the floodplain. This leaves the City unable to acquire certain properties for the Local Homestead Program. Even if the purchase prices of properties are within budget to acquire, the cost to rehabilitate is not feasible due to their location in the floodplain. Once the project to deepen Hickory Creek and Spring Creek is completed, a Letter of Map Revision will be requested. Once approved, some of the properties currently in the flood plain will be reclassified as no longer in the flood plain. This action will positively impact the City's ability to undertake new construction and rehabilitation projects in that area.

B. Foster and Maintain Affordable Housing

Code enforcement is the key to maintaining and improving the affordable housing stock. Rental and property maintenance inspectors work with various other departments to focus on problems that threaten safe and secure housing. The City utilizes an administrative review process to mitigate housing problems on a timely basis. Additionally, the City inspects rental properties through the Rental Inspection Program. All rental properties with three units or above and all non owner-occupied two units are required to be inspected. Properties are certified for two to four years, depending on the number of code violations and timeliness of the property owner's response to code violations. The City offers the Landlord Conference annually in order to provide continuing education to property owners on such topics as fair housing regulations, lead paint disclosure requirements, property maintenance codes, fire safety and crime prevention. The Conference consists of a 3 hour program which includes presentations by the Joliet Police Department, Illinois Department of Human Rights, Joliet

Regional Landlords Association, Community Investment Corporation, Energy Savers, the Will County Center for Community Concerns and an Eviction Attorney. Landlords receive the training program manual, the international property maintenance codes, rental inspection ordinances and other materials deemed appropriate to promote decent and safe housing. Attendance is mandatory for landlords brought in for an administrative hearing and is highly recommended for new and longtime landlords. The 2013 Conference included over 200 landlords.

Neighborhood Oriented Policing Team Officers (NOPT) work in eleven target areas throughout the City. These fourteen officers are familiar with the residents in their neighborhoods and respond to all calls for service during their shift. They are taught to seek long-term solutions to repeat problems and to work with residents to create a safer environment. Seven neighborhood groups: Cunningham (CT 8818 & 8814), St. John's (CT 8818 & 8819), St. Pat's (CT 8826), St. Mary Nativity (CT 8818 & 8819), NorthEast (Collins Street (CT8813), Parkwood (CT 8821) and SouthSide (CT 8825) are located in the low and moderate census tracts of Joliet. They hold meetings regularly attended by city officials. Neighborhood Councils, formed with the assistance of Unity CDC, work to address and resolve housing, safety and code enforcement issues in partnership with the City. These Neighborhood Councils are identified on the following map:

C. Eliminate Barriers to Affordable Housing

As of this writing, the City has submitted an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice to HUD. Based on the analysis of demographic and housing trends and conditions in

Joliet, potential impediments to fair housing choice were identified. These potential impediments are linked to the remedial strategies in the Fair Housing Action Plan included in Section 7 of the document. The following goals and strategies were proposed for funding as part of the 2013 Action Plan: Goal #3 (Strategies I and II), Goal #4 (Strategy II), Goal #5 (Strategy I) and Goal #12 (Strategy II). The balance of the goals in the City of Joliet 2011 Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice – Fair Housing Action Plan will be performed by staff or contracted with available funding.

D. Overcome Gaps in Institutional Structure and Enhance Coordination

The City of Joliet will continue to apply for funding from the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) as it becomes available to assist very low- and low-income households in the purchase of their first home. The City will work with Harris Bank and Peoples Home Equity, Inc. to finance the purchase of properties by qualified applicants through the Local Homestead and NSP1 and NSP3 programs.

In 2013, the City worked in cooperation with the Housing Authority of Joliet on issues related to public safety and resident initiatives. Neighborhood Oriented Police Teams are assigned to many of the housing authority sites. As mentioned previously, the City disbursed its final payment of HOME funds to the Housing Authority's Liberty Meadows Estates Development in 2013.

The City was actively involved in the Will County Continuum of Care in 2013 with the Director of Neighborhood Services serving on various committees.

E. Improve Public Housing and Resident Initiatives

The Housing Authority of Joliet was established by the City of Joliet for the purpose of building, operating and maintaining housing for low-income households. The City provides the usual public services, such as police and fire protection. The Housing Authority of Joliet's Board of Commissioners is a seven-member body appointed by the Mayor and City Council. Although the Board of Commissioners is appointed by the Mayor and City Council, under Illinois law it is a separate unit of local government and is not subject to City control. Commissioners determine policies and approve operating budgets, programs and services consistent with its mission and subject to the mandates and limits imposed by state and federal laws. With respect to hiring, contracting and procurement, the Housing Authority of Joliet is an entity separate from the City and is solely responsible for handling these activities and has its own personnel for that purpose. Additionally, decisions regarding proposed development sites, demolition or disposition of public housing developments are also within the purview of the Housing Authority, as is its Comprehensive Plan.

A complete review of the Housing Authority of Joliet is contained in the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice submitted to HUD in August 2011.

F. Evaluate and Reduce Lead-Based Paint Hazards

The homes which the City acquires and rehabilitates through its Local Homestead Program have been located in low and moderate census tracts, which include the majority of housing

units built prior to 1978. Purchasers of pre-1978 built city-owned houses are provided with a copy of the lead paint pamphlet, Protect Your Family From Lead in Your Home. The City also requires contractors to follow HUD's lead-based paint regulations for construction and rehabilitation projects funded through the CDBG and HOME programs. Work write-ups for projects include a section on lead-based paint testing and abatement when necessary under the current regulations. The City also includes a section on Residential Lead Paint Disclosure Requirements in the Landlord Training Manual, which landlords receive when they participate in the Landlord Conference. Staff attends training on these requirements when available. The City's property maintenance coordinator has completed HUD's Visual Assessment Course.

In Will County, three zip codes are high risk for lead poisoning: 60432, 60433 and 60436. All three of the zip codes are located in Joliet. The Illinois Lead Program Surveillance Report – 2012 contains the results of blood lead testing in Will County on all children 15 years old or younger:

- 11,417 children were tested in Will County
- 370 children had blood lead test results of 5-9 ug/dL
- 36 children had blood lead test results of 10 14 ug/dL
- 12 children had blood lead test results of 15 19 ug/dL
- 19 children had blood lead test results of 20+ ug/dL

The following are highlights from the 2012 Report:

- ➤ A total of 291,153 children were tested for blood lead poisoning from January through December 2012.
- ➤ About 97 percent of children tested were 6 years of age and younger at time of testing.
- Approximately one in 130 children tested was confirmed with a venous blood lead level of 10 micrograms per deciliter or greater, the current level for public health intervention in Illinois.
- Approximately one in 14 children (10 percent) tested was confirmed with a venous lead level of 5 micrograms per deciliter or greater, the recommended federal reference value for public health intervention.
- ➤ Of the 29,160 children tested in 2012 with blood lead levels of 5 micrograms per deciliter or greater:
 - 52 percent were males
 - 42 percent were children 1 and 2 years of age
 - 82 percent were receiving Medicaid benefits
 - 13.1 were black compared to 9.4 percent white

Education is a key component to reducing lead-based paint hazards. In Illinois, all children from low income families (i.e., Medicaid-eligible children) should receive a blood lead test at ages 12 and 24 months, even if they live in a low-risk zip code area. If the child is 3 through 6 years old and has not been tested, a blood lead test is required.

In 2009, Will County applied for and received a three year "Lead Hazard Control Program" grant in the amount of \$2,070,000.00. Will County has maintained the highest ranking – "green" and has cleared 176 units and added a State Licensed Lead Risk Assessor to their staff.

F. Ensure Compliance with Program and Comprehensive Planning Requirements

The City of Joliet's Consolidated Plan covers a 5-year period from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2014. The City of Joliet has been unable to complete the goals identified in the Consolidated Plan. Realization of the goals is dependent upon federal funding. The City reassesses all long-term goals prior to the development of each Annual Action Plan under the Consolidated Plan. This is accomplished by assessing progress made the previous year(s) and expectations for the upcoming year. This assessment is used as a tool to determine if specific goals were feasible. Additionally, each year the City reassesses the long-term goals in coordination with measurements of activity progress and benchmarks. This reassessment is conducted at the beginning of the 6th month of any Action Plan.

G. Reduce the Number of Persons Living Below the Poverty Level

The Neighborhood Services Division of the City of Joliet works closely with the Will County Continuum of Care, which set ups and offers training for individuals. The purpose of the training is to provide individuals living in homeless shelters or supportive housing with the education needed to obtain gainful employment. In 2013, three individuals received certified nurse assistant (CNA) training, two bilingual persons received Spanish interpreting training, one person received security officer training and one individual received food sanitation certification. Of the seven persons served, three obtained gainful employment upon follow-up.

In 2006, the City established the Quality of Life (QOL) Task Force to analyze the needs of District 4 and 5 residents in low and moderate income areas. One outcome of the Quality of Life Plan was the formation of Unity CDC, which will oversee proposed actions in ten subject areas in Districts 4 and 5. The subject areas are housing, education, human capital, industrial development, employment, land use, neighborhood character, recreation, retail development and transportation. The City is working closely with Unity CDC in the development and completion of the action items.

Leveraging Resources

In order to provide affordable housing, the City leveraged all resources available. The following resources were utilized in 2013:

Federal Resources

The City of Joliet spent CDBG program income in the amount of \$18,791.00 to demolish a deteriorated structure in the local target area. HOME funds were disbursed for the Housing Authority's Liberty Meadows Estates Development in the amount of \$128,586.49.

City of Joliet 18 2013 CAPER

The City also continued to successfully operate its Neighborhood Stabilization Program. At the end of 2013, a total of \$4,534,715.17 in grant funds and program income had been disbursed. A total of twenty-eight properties have been acquired since the program's inception. Of eighteen rehabilitated/constructed single family homes, eleven have been sold to qualified first-time homebuyers and five conveyed to non-profit organizations and the local housing authority to provide rental housing. The rehabilitation of the two remaining properties will be completed in 2014, at which time they will be sold to qualified homebuyers. Nine properties are currently land banked and a total of twenty-one properties (including the nine land banked properties) have been demolished. Three additional demolitions are planned for 2014.

State Resources

Neighborhood Stabilization Program III (NSP3): The City was awarded \$1,890,000.00 in NSP3 funds from the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) in 2011. As of year-end 2013, the City has completed the rehabilitation of two properties. One of the properties has been sold and the other will be conveyed to the Housing Authority of Joliet. The new construction of three single family homes is expected to be completed in early 2014 and these homes will be sold to qualified homebuyers. Two additional properties are currently being rehabbed and one property is scheduled for demolition. The City will expend all remaining funds by the March 15, 2014 deadline

Local Resources

ASSIST Program: In 2013, the City ceded \$10,000,000.00 of its bonding volume capacity (CAP) to the Assist Program, which provides 3% cash assistance to homebuyers at a low interest rate from local lenders and also allows the homebuyer to obtain a Mortgage Credit Certificate of up to \$2,000.00 per year on their federal income taxes for the life of their loan.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program: Formerly the Emergency Shelter Grant Program, the Emergency Solutions Grant Program was combined with HUD's Homeless Assistance Program through HEART Act legislation in 2009. Will County programs must apply to the state program administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO). Will County Center for Community Concerns received 2013 funds in the amount of \$287,820.00. The funds provide financial assistance and services to either prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless or to help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized.

Roadways Improvement Program: The City of Joliet implements neighborhood public projects through the Roadway Improvement Program. These projects include street construction, street lighting, drainage and storm sewer projects.

Local Lending Institutions: The City works with BMO Harris Bank and Peoples Home Equity, Inc. to procure first mortgage financing for qualified participants of the Local Homestead Program, NSP1 and NSP3 at current market rates.

Public Land Auction: The City of Joliet has been acquiring vacant parcels through a public auction administered by the Will County Tax Agent for the past sixteen years. Many of these properties are used for the development of new single family homes. The newly constructed homes are offered for sale through the Local Homestead Program.

Matching Requirements

The City of Joliet disbursed \$128,586.49 in HOME funds in 2013, resulting in a match liability of \$32,146.62 for the fiscal year. The HOME Match Liability Report can be found in **Appendix L**.

Citizen Comments

At the end of fiscal year 2012, the City had expended its remaining 2010 CDBG funds and committed its remaining 2010 HOME funds. A public hearing presenting the 2012 CAPER was held on February 28, 2013. The City executed FY 2011 – 2013 grant agreements with HUD in the fall of 2013. Two public hearings to discuss the proposed 2014 Annual Action Plan were held on October 15, 2013 and October 22, 2013. With no grant funding available until the fourth quarter of 2013, the City was unable to successfully undertake the activities outlined in the Consolidated Plan and 2013 Action Plan.

No public hearing was held on the 2013 CAPER. Copies of the 2013 CAPER are available at the Neighborhood Services Division and the City Clerk's Office, 150 West Jefferson Street, Joliet, IL and the two locations of the Joliet Public Library at 150 N. Ottawa Street and 3595 Black Road, Joliet, IL. The 2013 CAPER is also available to view online at the City of Joliet Website: www.cityofjoliet.info. The City extended the comment period to April 15th because no public hearing was held.

Certification of Consistency

During the 2013 fiscal year, the City of Joliet provided a Certificate of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan to IL-506 Joliet/Bolingbrook/Will County Continuum of Care. A copy is included as **Exhibit B.**

Self Evaluation

CDBG Activities

Local Homestead Program: The City was unable to undertake this activity in 2013. The remaining inventory, a condominium unit, will be conveyed to Will County Habitat for Humanity in February 2014. The City will continue to provide affordable housing through the NSP1 and NSP3 programs. Additionally, the City will apply for available Illinois Housing Development (IHDA) Trust Fund monies as they become available.

Code Enforcement – Inspection of Housing Units & Environment: The City has a comprehensive code enforcement program that includes four property maintenance evaluators who investigate complaints about housing and minor environmental issues. The complaint system has been updated so that residents may now file a complaint online as well as by telephone. Complaints are received by the Complaint Desk and forwarded to the appropriate department for follow up. Inspections are made and owners are encouraged to mitigate violations in a reasonable period of time. Administrative hearings are initiated if issues are not resolved in a timely and satisfactory manner. This activity has benefited the City's residents by promoting decent and safe affordable housing. In 2013, this activity was undertaken with city funds and 4494 cases were assigned to the property maintenance evaluators and 3626 cases closed.

Rental Inspection Program: Although funded by general corporate funds, the Rental Inspection Program has positively impacted rental households throughout the City by providing safe, sanitary and decent housing. Established in 1986, the program is responsible for the inspection of all rental properties with three units or above and all non owner-occupied two units. Properties are certified for two or four years, depending on the number of code violations and the timeliness of the property owner's response to code violations. The two rental inspectors respond to health and safety complaints, such as missing smoke detectors, inoperable mechanical systems, overcrowding and structural deficiencies in addition to their regular certification inspections.

Clearance and Demolition: This activity creates a suitable living environment through the elimination of slum and blight. By demolishing structures that are vacant, dilapidated and structurally unsound, the City improves neighborhoods by removing possible health and safety threats. The City demolished one non-city owned property in the local target area in 2013 with CDBG program income. The City also demolished three properties in the target area utilizing NSP1 funds. The City anticipates demolishing three eligible properties with NSP1 funds in 2014.

Graffiti Removal: This program entails the removal of gang graffiti and other tagging from public and private property. The City's efforts to increase awareness of this program, which is offered free of charge, has been quite successful. As a result, performance came close to meeting expectations and the objective of creating suitable living environments has been accomplished. In 2013, the salary of the graffiti abatement specialist and graffiti supplies were paid with city funds.

HOME Activities

CHDO Set Aside: In 2013, no CHDO set aside funds were available to allocate. It is anticipated that Cornerstone Services, Inc. and Will County Habitat for Humanity will complete their housing projects in 2014, which are partially funded with previously committed 2009 and 2010 HOME funds.

Housing Authority of Joliet Project: The City of Joliet disbursed the remaining \$128,586.49 of its commitment to the Housing Authority of Joliet's Liberty Meadows Estates Development in 2013.

Monitoring

Activities funded under the HOME program are monitored based on the number of assisted units in the project for a period that is equal to a specific activity's period of affordability. A notification letter or e-mail is sent to each HOME-assisted agency at least two weeks prior to the monitoring visit and includes the date and scope of the inspection. Follow-up letters are sent after the monitoring visit to advise the agency of any concerns, findings or corrective actions to be taken. Currently, on-site monitoring visits are conducted at the following HOME-assisted rental housing projects: Victory Centre of Joliet, Louis Joliet Apartments and Cornerstone Services, Inc. HOME-assisted files are reviewed for compliance with affordability, income targeting and tenant participation requirements. Leases are examined to confirm that they contain no prohibited provisions, terms are at least one year (unless otherwise agreed upon by the tenant and owner), rents do not exceed the maximum HOME rents and that they are properly executed. Income certification and source documentation are also reviewed. Inspections are made of 15% of the HOME-assisted units to ensure that minimum property standards are met.

CDBG Program Narrative

Assessment of relationship between the use of CDBG funds to the priorities, needs, goals and specific objectives identified in the Consolidated Plan.

The priority needs, goals and objectives identified in the 2010 - 2014 Consolidated Plan were based on an analysis of 2000 census data reports. The data indicated that very low-income households had the greatest housing needs, irrespective of their status as renters or homeowners. Approximately two-thirds of total households in this income category (earning less than 30% of the median family income) had housing problems and cost burden exceeding 30% of their income. Additionally, 43% of this income group experienced severe cost burden, exceeding 50% of their income. Rental households in the extremely low and low-income categories experienced cost burdens of 47% and 45.9%, respectively. Over 66.7% of extremely low- income elderly owner households experienced cost burden. Further analysis indicated that the incidence of housing problems experienced by minorities was disproportionately greater when compared to the city's population as a whole. Based upon the identified housing needs, the City determined that affordable housing was the primary priority need. The same process was applied to determine the other priority needs: elimination of slum and blight and public service.

In order to reach the goals and specific objectives identified in the Consolidated Plan, eligible activities were chosen that would best meet the priority needs. The City of Joliet *only recently* executed FY 2011 – 2013 Grant Agreements with HUD in the fall of 2013 for a total of \$2,734,685.00 in CDBG funds and \$1,196,984.00 in HOME funds. As a result, the City was unable to successfully undertake the activities outlined in the Consolidated Plan and 2013 Action Plan.

The following narratives provide a brief description of CDBG activity undertaken in 2013, the geographic distribution of those assisted by the program and the funds expended.

1. Code Enforcement (Clearance and Demolition): This activity is the demolition of vacant, dilapidated structures throughout the city. One property in the City's target area was demolished with CDBG program income.

HOME Program Narrative

Resale and Recapture Requirements for HOME: The City of Joliet imposes recapture requirements on HOME-assisted housing. The HOME-assisted units must meet the affordability requirements for not less than the applicable period specified in the table on the following page, beginning after project completion.

HOME amount per-unit	Affordability in years
Under \$15,000.00	5
\$15,000.00 to \$40,000.00	10
Over \$40,000.00	15

At the time the homebuyer purchases the HOME-assisted property as their personal residence, a mortgage is signed and recorded. The amount of the HOME funds and the affordability period are included in the document. If the buyer chooses to sell the premises or no longer use it as his/her principal residence during the affordability period, the City's mortgage will appear on the title commitment. The City will be notified when a payoff figure is requested. The entire amount of the HOME investment will be recaptured out of the net proceeds of any sale of HOME-assisted property. Net proceeds include the sales price, less loan repayments. If the net proceeds are not sufficient to recapture the entire HOME investment, plus allow the homeowner to recover the amount of their down payment, acquisition cost, principal payment and any other capital improvements, then the City may reduce the amount of recapture on a prorated basis. The proration will be based on the length of time the homeowner occupies the property relative to the required affordability period as outlined in the above table. Once funds are recaptured, they will be utilized to assist other first time homebuyers as required by HUD. The requirements of this paragraph shall survive closing and shall not merge in the deed to the premises. The seller may incorporate the HOME and federal affordability requirements into deed restrictions, restrictive covenants or similar instruments.

HOME Matching Requirements


The HOME match requirement for all HOME-eligible activities is 25% of any funds expended. The City of Joliet will use the following sources for match: IHDA Housing Trust Fund monies, waived building permit fees and other associated new construction costs. The

City contributed match of \$32,146.62 in 2013. The HOME Match Report is included as **Exhibit C.**

MBE and WBE Business Report

No contracts were awarded for the CDBG or HOME programs during the FY 2013 reporting period. A copy of the Annual Performance Report – HOME Program is included as **Exhibit D.**

It is the policy of the City to provide equal opportunities to firms owned by minority business enterprises and women's business enterprises to bid on all contracts awarded by the City of Joliet. Furthermore, it is the City's policy to prohibit discrimination against any business in pursuit of these opportunities, to conduct its contracting activities so as to prevent such discrimination, to correct present effects of past discrimination and to resolve complaints of discrimination. The City maintains a mailing list of small, minority and women-owned businesses interest in doing residential rehabilitation work. A notice of bid availability is routinely distributed to businesses on this mailing list and is advertised in the legal section of the local newspaper. The City also encourages minority participation in non-housing community development projects, such as demolition and clearance, weed cutting and board ups. The City maintains a list of minority and women-owned businesses which is updated annually. A copy of the 2013 Minority Business Listing is included as **Exhibit E.**

Cicero The Leadership Committee provides oversight, coordination, and acts as the decision-making body to ensure that the mission and purpose of the Will County Continuum of Care as set forth in the bylaws is achieved. In support of this purpose, the Leadership Committee shall have the authority to: set and assign goals to committees; assess the progress of goals of Continuum committees; combine and/or eliminate Continuum committees if the need arises to accomplish continuum goals; respond to Committee requests to assist with problem solving and development of initiatives designed to fill homeless service gaps; and to provide technical assistance as needed.

The Leadership Committee members are assigned by the participating agencies of the Continuum of Care set forth in the bylaws and the chairs of the other four committees. Additional members may be added by an amendment to the bylaws and approved by the decision of the committee. Included members are: governmental entities, elected officials, homeless housing providers, and non-profit agencies. Officer terms are two years. Nominations are made at the July meeting, voting takes place at the September meeting, and officers for the next two years are announced at the November meeting. 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

Homeless Prevention (HP)









The Homeless Prevention Program of the Illinois Department of Human Services (DHS) provides rental/mortgage assistance, security deposit assistance, utility assistance, approved case management, and approved supportive services to individuals and families who are in imminent danger of eviction, foreclosure or homeless, or are currently homeless. Supportive services must directly relate to the prevention of homelessness. These services are provided in an effort to stabilize families in their existing homes, shorten the amount of time that individuals and families stay in shelters, and assist individuals and families with securing affordable housing. The households must document to the provider a temporary economic crisis beyond household control.





Funding for the Homeless Prevention Program is announced annually by IDHS. The funding announcement is directed to the local Continuums of Care (CoC) with the availability of funds. For a number of years, the Will County Continuum of Care has selected Catholic Charities – Diocese of Joliet as the agency to receive these funds and administer the program. This program has done what it was designed to do: prevent homelessness. However, the State of Illinois has decreased the funding for this program dramatically (from \$163,900 to \$21,840) and it is constantly at risk to be cut entirely. We did receive ESG funding (explained below), but that funding was lower than the previous Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing Program (HPRP) and still is insufficient to meet the needs of the ever increasing at-risk population that needs to be diverted from the already overburdened homeless prevention and homeless services system.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program















HPRP was created by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 as a HUD program to provide financial assistance and services to either prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless or to help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized. HPRP was focused on housing for homeless and at-risk households. The Will County Center for Community Concerns (WCCCC) and Catholic Charities, Diocese of Joliet partnered to administer this program in Will County and all of the funds were expended prior to 2012. The Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program (formerly the Emergency Shelter Grant Program) was combined with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's Homeless Assistance Programs through HEARTH Act legislation in 2009. While Will County was an HPRP grantee, the county is not a direct recipient of ESG funding. Will County programs must apply to the state program administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO). The new ESG program supports services similar to both the HPRP program and the old ESG program, the funding is not sufficient to replace the annual funding amounts received through HPRP and the old ESG program.


DCEO, using a formula allocation similar to that used by the DHS HP program discussed above, allocated \$239,765 in ESG funds to the Will County Continuum of Care for the 2012 program year. Due to a quick turn around needed in response to the state, our leaders decided that programs would receive the same amount of emergency shelter-related funds through the 2012 ESG allocation as they did in the 2011 allocation from DCEO that did not go through CoC's. This was to minimize the change and not put the organizations at risk of losing funding right away that they had received in the past. It was also decided that the remainder of the funding was to be proportionately divided among the agencies that received HPRP funding in order to continue those activities and help make up the deficiency we have been experiencing in HMIS funding that has not increased in about 12 years despite increasing technology costs.

We are now in the process of determining how to distribute the 2013 funds in the amount of \$287,820. The application for the CoC is due to DCEO on April 15th, and individual program applications will be due at the end of April. Anyone interested in this funding application should contact the coordinator. There will be a meeting to discuss these funds in the very near future.



2012 Point-In-Time (PIT) Homeless Count

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that communities receiving federal funds from the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Grants program conduct a point-in-time count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons at least every other year. We are required to identify whether a person is an individual, a member of a family unit, an unaccompanied youth, or whether a person is chronically homeless, indicating long-time or repeated homelessness and the presence of a disability. Communities report the numbers from their point-in-time counts as part their Continuum of Care (CoC) application. Starting in 2010, PIT Counts are input directly into HUD's Homelessness Data Exchange (HDX) website.

HUD requires that these counts occur during the last week of January. In 2012, Will County's count was on January 26th. The first of these counts for which data was assimilated nationally was conducted in January 2005. Many communities conduct point-in-time counts annually, rather than just meet the minimum requirement of counting biannually. Will County has conducted our counts annually every year since 2004.

Point-in-time counts are important because they establish the dimensions of the problem of homelessness and help policymakers and program administrators track progress toward the goal of ending homelessness. Collecting data on homelessness and tracking progress can inform public opinion, increase public awareness, and attract resources that will lead to the eradication of the problem. For example, if homeless youth are not included in local point-in-time counts, their needs could be under-represented as governments, nonprofits, and key stakeholders at the federal, state, and local level plan to respond to the problem.

HUD uses information from the local point-in-time counts, among other data sources, in the congressionally-mandated Annual Homeless Assessment Report to Congress (AHAR). This report is meant to inform Congress about the number of people experiencing homelessness in the U.S. and the effectiveness of HUD's programs and policies in decreasing those numbers. On the

local level, the PIT Counts help our community plan services and programs to appropriately address local needs, measure progress in decreasing homelessness, and identify strengths and gaps (unmet needs) in Will County's current homelessness assistance system.

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Homeless Services Program

All clients served have been referred by homeless service providers and the data provided is for time period from October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012 in order to coincide with the federal funding cycle. An average of 5 households per day signed in for services. The household and individual numbers are unduplicated, though a household may have received services on separate occasions. The living situation is representative of where the household stayed the night prior to their first service. The referral sources are reflective of the agency that first referred the households, though many households were referred by more than one agency over the course of the program year.



The chart to the left shows the percentages of the budget utilized for each type of service. A total of \$30,260.51 was expended for services during the program year. The percentages are rounded to the nearest whole percentage. The average cost of services (not including case management) was \$85.24 per household or \$66.51 per person.

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4th Week Phenomenon Program

The 4th Week program was formed out of a concept that was developed during the authoring of the CoC's 10-year plan to end chronic homelessness. The "4th Week Phenomenon" represents monthly population shifts of individuals who live in the inexpensive hotels and motels in the area until their monthly benefit funds run out. They then move into shelters or live on the streets for the fourth week of the month or until the money becomes available again on the first of the month. They then move back into the hotels and motels for as long as the money lasts.

Once admitted into the program, a client will attend two scheduled case management sessions per month for six months. During these sessions, they work with the case manager to assess their self-sufficiency in key areas including health, income, employment, education, etc. They then create and set attainable goals centered on increasing their self-sufficiency in each of those areas. Where applicable, the clients are referred to other agencies and organizations for services to assist them with the completion of their goals. Once per month over the six-month time frame, the program will pay for one week's hotel or motel expenses. The payment is made directly to the hotel/motel on the condition that they are willing to accept payment and that the client is on good terms with the business.

The 4th Week Program has successfully partnered with five hotels/motels that have been willing to accept payments for clients enrolled in the program: Hotel Plaza, Inc., Crest Hill Inn, Joliet Inn, Starr Inn, Town House Motel, Bel-Air Motel, Crown Inn, Red Roof Inn, Sands Motel, and the Elk's Motel.

Around 30% of the participants in this program to date have obtained a "positive outcome," which means they were placed into permanent or transitional housing. Many of the remaining individuals had housing barriers that prevented them from placement into rental units. Those barriers included poor rental histories, poor credit, prior evictions, criminal background, etc. Longer term or permanent supportive housing programs would have served those participants well, however, there were no appropriate permanent supportive housing beds available to them. Some chose to remain in the hotel/motel and continue trying to pay on a daily or weekly basis; others elected to enroll in shelter programs. Other participants either did not take full advantage of the program or simply quit the program after receiving assistance. We were not able to follow-up with some of the individuals because they did not stay in contact. However, all of the enrolled clients were able to remain stably sheltered at the hotel/motel where they were residing and made progress toward eliminating the barriers that prevent them from obtaining permanent housing.

Staff has and will continue to incorporate some of the assessment and case management tools created for the Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program and Emergency Solutions Grant Program into the 4th Week Program, including the self-sufficiency matrix module that was added to HMIS. These tools will help with identifying the target population, strengthening outreach efforts, and recording progress. The housing search and placement resources developed will also be very useful for the participants of this program.
